

At St Lawrence Catholic Primary School we offer high quality inclusive teaching (quality first teaching) for all children.

One Page Profile

If your child's teacher identifies that they need additional support in order to make good progress a One Page Profile will be created. The One Page Profile will be written by your child's teacher in collaboration with your child. A paper copy will be sent home once a term where you will have the opportunity to contribute. Measurable and achievable targets will be set as part of the profile and these will be reviewed termly by your child's teacher and the SENDCO. Review outcomes will be sent home in the spring and summer term where parents have the opportunity to contribute to the plan.

Good progress is made due to the additional support in place. The child no longer needs intervention to make good progress. The One Page Profile isn't re-issued and the child is closely monitored as part of quality first teaching.

Interventions take place, however your child continues to benefit from support in order to make good progress. Advice from external professionals is sought. This may include:

- A speech and language assessment referral
- An Occupational Therapy assessment referral
- A Behaviour Advisory consultant referral
- An Educational Psychologist referral
- A Child Development Clinic referral
- A CAMHs referral
- Advice from the SENSS team (for visual impairment, hearing impairment or physical needs)

These referrals will be made by the SENDCO together with your child's class teacher. The referral will be discussed with you and you will be asked to provide parental consent. Your child's One Page Profile will be re-issued with additional targets from outside agency support.

If, after external professional advice is sought and your child continues to benefit from a high level of support and intervention an Education Health and Care Plan may be applied for. This is very specific and individual support for your child which comes with additional funding to the school in order for us to meet your child's needs. The EHC plan application process will be explained to you by the school's SENDCO and your parental consent and input will be sought. If your child is given an EHC plan they will receive additional input and support as part of their statutory requirements outlined in their plan. You will be invited to an annual review which will take place at least once every year to discuss your child's progress in accordance with their EHC plan.
